BY-LAW BUZZ: Dogs

No person may keep a dog-

- 1. Which barks, whimpers or howls to the extent that it causes a disturbance;
- 2. Which suffers from an infectious or contagious disease;
- 3. On premises not fenced, so that it is at all times confined to the premises.

No person may bring a dog into a public place if-

- 1. It is wild, dangerous or ferocious;
- 2. It is in the habit of chasing or charging at people or vehicles;
- 3. It is an unsterilised female on heat.

In Public Places:

- 1. Any dog must be kept on a leash and under control;
- 2. A person in control of a dog must remove any defecation of such dog.

Prohibited Behaviour:

- 1. No person may, without reasonable grounds, incite a dog against, or attack or put fear into, any person, animal or bird
- 2. No person may provoke, harass or tease any dog.
- 3. No person may terrify, or cause stress or fear to any dog with fireworks or by any other means.
