FIREWORKS - Some Useful Information

Prescribed times for fireworks:

| New Year's Eve | 11pm – 1am |

| New Year's Day | 7pm – 10pm |
| Christmas Eve | 7pm – 10pm |
| Lag Ba'omer | 7pm – 10pm |
| Chinese New Year | 7pm – 10pm |
| Human Rights Day | 7pm – 10pm |
| Freedom Day | 7pm – 10pm |
| Guy Fawkes Day | 7pm – 10pm |
| Hindu New Year | 7pm – 10pm |
| Diwali | 7pm – 10pm |
| Day of Goodwill | 7pm – 10pm |

Some Guidelines for the use of Fireworks:

- 1. It is illegal to buy fireworks from hawkers.
- 2. It is illegal to sell fireworks from a residential house.
- 3. Children can ignite fire-works only under adult supervision.
- 4. Fireworks should be ignited outdoors only.
- 5. Don't ignite fireworks on dry leaves, trees and flammable materials, or near animals.

The DEADLY ONION BOMB firework is a professional standard pyrotechnic that can cause life-threatening injuries



POINTS TO PONDER:

- Child labour is still used extensively in firework manufacture in India and China.
- Nearly half of the fireworks produced in China fail to meet basic quality and safety standards.
- 3. Three sparklers together create the same heat as a blow torch.
- 4. Bottle rockets are highly dangerous as their flight path is erratic, and their explosive power is enough to turn a 'launch site' bottle or can, into shrapnel.
- 5. Using fireworks near animals is both cruel and inhumane as it causes immense fear and stress and will incur a fine of R1 000.00
